**Governor addresses cadets in the 'Ek Bharat Shreshta Bharat' NCC Camp**

**NCC inculcates self-discipline, obedience, sincerity and determination amongst the cadets: Governor**

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Brig. (Dr.) B.D. Mishra (Retd.) addressed the cadets of National Cadet Corps (NCC) at their camp on the 'Ek Bharat Shreshta Bharat Camp (EBSB) conducted by Additional Director General, NCC North Eastern Region at Tezpur University, Tezpur on 10<sup>th</sup> January 2018.

Speaking on the occasion, the Governor exhorted the Cadets to imbibe leadership instinct to serve the Nation, develop sublime personality traits and join the Indian Armed Forces. NCC is a very important institution, which has been instilling nationalism, patriotism and spirit of 'Nation First' amongst the young students, he said.

Recalling his first NCC Camp of 1955, in which he received the Best Social Service Award, the Governor said that it was the beginning of his life of punctuality and discipline. It inculcates self-discipline, obedience, sincerity and determination amongst the cadets.

Stating that the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi was also a NCC cadet, the Governor advised them to follow the guiding principle of their organization to rise in life. NCC cadets must personify the motto of National Cadet Corps, which is 'Unity and Discipline', he said.

The Governor advised the cadets to have self pride and self respect. Cadets must study hard and think, believe, say and act for the Nation.

First Lady of the State Smt Neelam Misra, Major General Raju Chauhan, Additional Director General, NCC NER, Group Commander, NCC Group Headquarters, Tezpur Brig. K.S. Rao, Deputy Group Commander Col. R.B. Patil and Pro Vice Chancellor, Tezpur University Professor Dilip Kumar Saikia were also present amongst other.

Earlier on his arrival at the Camp, a Gurad of Honour was presented to the Governor commanded by Senior Under Officer Vanisha Dutta. Ek Bharat Shreshta Bharat (EBSB) camp aims to provide opportunity for understand the cultural diversity, history, flora and fauna and its people. It also aims to create awareness amongst the cadets regarding diverse cultural heritage of the country. The EBSB camp at Tezpur University, which is being organised from 1<sup>st</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> January 2019, has 600 cadets, which includes 100 cadets from Uttar Pradesh, and the rest from all eight Groups of North Eastern Region (NER).
