The Chief Postmaster General, North-East Circle, Shri Brajesh Kumar, called on the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt Gen K.T. Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.), at Shillong on 4<sup>th</sup> June 2026. They discussed on issue a series of Commemorative Postage Stamps showcasing the rich heritage, vibrant culture, and unique identity of Arunachal Pradesh.

The Chief Postmaster General briefed the Governor on the approval process and the proposed themes for the stamp series, which include the indigenous tribes and traditions of Arunachal Pradesh, heritage sites, rich flora and fauna, Geographical Indication (GI)-tagged indigenous products, and traditional handicrafts. These stamps are envisaged as a medium to celebrate and preserve the State's diverse cultural and natural legacy.

A keen philatelist and stamp collector himself, Governor Parnaik expressed deep appreciation for the initiative. Drawing from his personal interest in philately, he observed that postage stamps are much more than postal instruments; they are enduring symbols of history, culture, and national pride that connect generations and educate people across geographical boundaries. He emphasized that commemorative stamps dedicated to Arunachal Pradesh would help document the State's unique story and secure its rightful place in the annals of India's postal heritage.

The Governor said that such stamps would serve as cultural ambassadors, introducing the State's traditions, achievements, biodiversity, and indigenous wisdom to audiences across the country and around the world.
