State Food Commission Chairman Calls on Governor

Governor recommends greater use of digital tools for efficient food distribution

Governor emphasizes the importance of transparency and accountability in the implementation of food security programmes

Governor advocates inclusion of locally available nutritious foods in government nutrition programmes

The Chairman of the State Food Commission, Shri Tarh Tarak, called on the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.), at Lok Bhavan, Itanagar, on 11th August 2026. They discussed strengthening food security mechanisms, improving service delivery and ensuring that welfare benefits reach every eligible citizen, particularly those living in remote and border areas of the State.

The Governor emphasized the importance of transparency and accountability in the implementation of food security programmes. He advised the Commission to promote regular social audits of the Public Distribution System (PDS), Mid-Day Meal Scheme and Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS). Such measures, he said, would help identify gaps, prevent leakages and enhance public trust in welfare schemes while ensuring that benefits reach the intended beneficiaries.

Highlighting the role of technology in governance, the Governor recommended greater use of digital tools for efficient food distribution. He suggested end-to-end digitization of the supply chain through GPS-enabled transportation, electronic Point of Sale (e-PoS) devices, Aadhaar-enabled authentication and real-time monitoring systems. These measures, he noted, would improve transparency, reduce pilferage and ensure timely delivery of food grains across the State.

Drawing from his experience, the Governor underscored the need to look beyond food availability and focus on nutrition security. He advocated the inclusion of locally available nutritious foods such as millets, fruits, vegetables, eggs and pulses in government nutrition programmes. Special attention, he said, must be given to children, pregnant women, lactating mothers and other vulnerable groups to combat malnutrition and build a healthier Arunachal Pradesh.

The Chairman was accompanied by members of the State Food Commission, Shri Maji Chokar and Shri Ngasah Tanjang.
